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# **FOREWORD**

Following the appointment of Rev Roy Turner as team vicar in the Benifice of Brize Norton (St Britius) and Carterton (St John the Evangelist) in 2003, a team led by him set out to establish and run a church plant on the new Shilton Park estate between the town of Carterton and the village of Brize Norton. This book tells the story of its foundation and its evolution through the years from 2004 to 2012.

A special effort has been made to catalogue the various themes, activities and resources used throughout the church plant so that they might be of use to succeeding generations. Indeed many of these resources have since be used at Roy's parishes of Stonesfield and Coombe.

The Church Plant was called the Necklace Project and had three distinct phases which are explained in Part 1 of the book. Part 2 discussed the resources and Part 3 the individual projects. # **NECLACE IN NUMBERS**

Here is a note of number of each - family hour, SPCC, Light Zone, etc.

Necklace Family Hour ran 66 sessions between September 2004 and April 2008 (three and a half years)

Shilton Park Cafe Church ran 80 plus sessions\* between April 2008 and November 2011 (three and a half yeas)

The Light Zone ran 20 sessions\* between November 2011 and November 2012 (one year)

So, in total we ran well over 166 sessions over the life of the Necklace Project (9 years)

In addition the Necklace Buggy Club ran throughout and there we several other "outings" and events.

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# PART 1 - Chapter 1

# **Necklace Project - Origin, Objectives and Location**

Necklace stands for North East Carterton Key to Life and Caring for Everyons and as the name implies it refers specifically to the new estate in Carterton known as Shilton Park. This estate was established around 2000 and grew exponentially throughout the life of the Necklace Project. It was based at St John the Evanglist C of E Primary school on the estate.



The Necklace Project was an initiative by the Diocese of Oxford within the parishes of St John the Evangalist in Carterton and St Britius in Brize Norton. The project was led by Rev. Roy Turner, team vicar. The Necklace Team consisted of a planning group of 12 people (Roy & Bev, Phil & Mary, Sandy & Ian, Ali, Jackie, Billy, Jenny, Liz and Sarah.)

There was a pre-launsh stall at St John's school garden party on 26th June 2004 when we ran out of entry forms for our free competitions with over 160 entries. Guess the number of sweets, guess the weight of the cake and guess the Euro 2004 football winner. The project was set to start on 5th September 2004 with a Fun Day open to all.

Activities included a free street team tug of war, free barbeque and pig roast, bouncy castle and puppet shows, a street performer and archery, as well as face painting. The whole event was sponsored by the housing developer for the estate. (Sponsors included Adventure Plus, Barratt Homes, David Wilson Homes, The Falcons, George Wimpey, Marshall Aerospace, Persimmon Homes, Sainsbury, Spar, The Co-op, Waitroase, Foxbury Farm & Westbury Home Finder)

There were in fact two Fun Days, the first in September 2004 and the seconde a year later.

Once starte the project met at St John's C of E Primary School. Regular activities launched in September 2004 included a Buggy Club on Friday mornings, a Pop in for a chat 'nd a cuppa on Friday afternoons with plans for an after school club. Our Sunday Family Hour introduced the



St John's the Evangelist Primary School, Shilton Park, Carterton.

Necklace Puppet Crew, a cafe style discussion with time for reflection. This became known as The Shilton Park Cafe Church (SPCC). SPCC later moved its location to become the Light Zone. SPCC & Light Zone were designed to help people to meet together and make new friends on the estate, and to help the community grow and develop together.

Our vision was to reach out to people with good news about Jesus and to show God's love in a practical way.




The Necklace Kids

The Necklace Family Hour was held from 3 pm to 4 pm in St John's Primary School Hall on the first and third Sundays each month. There were craft activities, the Necklace puppets, quizes, parachute games and more for the kids. For the adults if they wish, there was a thought for the week, The afternoon was designed to be fun, entertaining and informative.

The programme for the Necklace Family Hours is given in Chapter 2.

The Necklace Family Hour was followed by the introduction of Shilton Park Cafe Church which is the subject of Chapter 3. It was the second stage in the evolution of the church plant to introduce elements of Christian worship. The third evolution was the Light Zone which is the subject of Chapter 3, whilst other aspects are covered in separate chapters (see the contents page)

#### **Seeker Course**

The result is is best summed up in a Report produced in 2008 which is given in full.

The Necklace Project had a major change of direction at Easter 2008 when the Shilton Park Café Church (SPCC) was commenced with services on the first and third Sundays of each month from 11 am at St John's Primary School. Our resources meant that the Family Hour which had been running for over three years ceased.

Shilton Park Cafe Church (SPCC) is an informal service using a theme. This has been the Ten Commandments using J John's material and lasted for about an hour. The "menu" commenced with refreshments before the lighting of candles to signify the start of our worship. Songs and hymns were followed by a short video for the children who then had craft activity while a presentation and talk on the chosen theme is given. Following a break to top up the coffee and for people to write "post-it" prayers, there were more songs. Our prayers were set against suitable background music and we finished with an action song for the children. Both the Service Menu to explain the sequence of events and a feedback form were on every table.

The Necklace Project had other areas of activity during 2008: The Necklace Buggy Club and an After School Club — "Jesus And Me" - and technical support for the St John's Primary School Website. We also introduced The Foxbury Farm Nativity. The Necklace Puppets perform at SPCC and at St Britius Church and the puppeteers include four teenagers. Our 30-minute production entitled "Angels Aware" involved eight puppeteers.

The Buggy Club was full to capacity and SPCC attracted up to 40 people at each session. Many of the families who support the Necklace Project worshiped at St John's and St Britius as well, a good example of Fresh Expressions in practice.

# After Five Years we reported in The Door\*

The Necklace Project - Five Year Old

The Necklace Project is run by a team of committed Christians that meet regularly to plan and organise activities for the Shilton Park housing estate within Carterton. Necklace stands for North East Carterton Key to Life And Caring for everyone and reflects the initial focus on the social needs of the community on Shilton Park and especially the needs of families. The focus is being extended to look after the spiritual needs of the community. The activities are designed to be relevant, accessible, stimulating and to use 21st century communication methods, so the emphasis is on community, friendship, relationships and service. The team endeavour to practice what they "preach" - worshipping through action and teaching by example.

Shilton Park Cafe Church (SPCC) is an informal service using a theme, such as the Ten Commandments and lasts for about an hour. It currently meets on the first and third Sunday of each month in St John's Primary School Hall on the Shilton Park Estate. The "menu" commences with refreshments before the lighting of candles to signify the start of our worship. Songs and hymns are followed by a short video for the children who then have craft activity while a presentation and talk on the chosen theme is given. Following a break to top up the coffee and for people to write "post-it" prayers, there are more songs. Our prayers are set against suitable background music and we finish with an action song for the children. Both the Service Menu to explain the sequence of events and a feedback form are on every table.

The Necklace Project has other areas of activity: The Necklace Buggy Club and an After School Club – Jesus And Me - and technical support for the St John's Primary School Website. Over the first three years of its existence activities included the Necklace Family Hour, Drop-in Sessions associated with Golden Book Assemblies at St John's Primary School, the Necklace Fun Days, the Necklace Barn Dance and Treasure Hunt as well as adult courses to introduce Christian teaching and worship.

We have also introduced novel forms of worship at Christmas with our Posada Crib Service and at Easter with our Easter Garden. The Foxbury Farm Nativity is the latest example.

The Necklace Puppets perform at SPCC and at St Britius Church and the puppeteers include four teenagers. A recent 30-minute production entitled "Angels Aware" involved eight puppeteers.

Many of the families who support the Necklace Project now worship at St John's and St Britius as well, a good example of Fresh Expressions in practice.

# Necklace Project & SPCC Report for 2010/11

The Necklace Project commenced in 2004. The acronym (North East Carterton Key to Life and Caring for Everyone) explained our vision and purpose. The Necklace Project had a major change of direction at Easter 2008 when the Shilton Park Café Church (SPCC) was commenced with services on the first and third Sundays of each month from 11 am at St John's Primary School. Our resources meant that the Family Hour which had been running for over three years had to cease.

Shilton Park Cafe Church (SPCC) is an informal service using a theme. We commence with refreshments before the lighting of candles to signify the start of our worship.

Songs and hymns are followed by a short video for the children. Following a break to top up the coffee and for people to write "post-it" prayers, there is a craft activity for the children while a presentation and talk on the chosen theme is given. Our prayers are set against suitable background music and we finish with an action song for the children.

We are engaged in the next stage of development as a church plant that introduces additional "services" on the second and fourth Sunday of each month including an opportunity for bible readings and for communion. After Easter 2011 we will be meeting at the Vicarage at 8 Trefoil Way on the second Sunday of each month from 11 am.

SPCC attracts up to 40 people at each session. Many of the families who support the Necklace Project now worship at St John's and St Britius as well, a good example of Fresh Expressions in practice. SPCC runs regular study groups at the Vicarage and members meet up for coffee/lunch at the Community Café on a Wednesday morning from 10.30 am.

Funding has become an issue now that St John's School decided to charge £91 for two sessions per month, so we are encouraging our regular attendees to contribute using gift aid wherever possible. Hopefully this may give us enough money to continue at our present venue.

The Necklace Project has other areas of activity. The Necklace Buggy Club continues to meet every Friday in term time. This now takes place in the vicarage with around 8-20 mothers with toddlers. The Foxbury Farm Nativity is run each year.

The Necklace Project is run by a team of volunteers who meet monthly to plan the activities. The Necklace web site at www.brizenorton.org.uk/necklace carries information.

# **Shilton Park Cafe Church (SPCC)**





The Necklace Project had a major change of direction at Easter 2008 when the Shilton Park Café Church (SPCC) was commenced with services on the first and third Sundays of each month from 11 am at St John's Primary School. Our resources meant that the Family Hour which had been running for over three years ceased.

Shilton Park Cafe Church (SPCC) is an informal service using a theme. This has been the Ten Commandments using J John's material and lasts for about an hour. The "menu" commences with refreshments before the lighting of candles to signify the start of our worship. Songs and hymns are followed by a short video for the children who then have craft activity while a presentation and talk on the chosen theme is given. Following a break to top up the coffee and for people to write "post-it" prayers, there are more songs. Our prayers are set against suitable background music and we finish with an action song for the children. Both the Service Menu to explain the sequence of events and a feedback form are on every table.

The Necklace Project had other areas of activity during 2008: The Necklace Buggy Club and an After School Club – Jesus And Me - and technical support for the St John's Primary School Website. We have also introduced The Foxbury Farm Nativity. The Necklace Puppets perform at SPCC and at St Britius Church and the puppeteers include four teenagers. Our 30-minute production entitled "Angels Aware" involved eight puppeteers. The scripts used by the puppets are in Part 2 a short video shows the children enjoying themselves.

MOVING ON! - A FRESH EXPRESSION

At an SPCC Planning Meeting at the Vicarage on Wednesday 12th October 2011, James proposed a new style of Service in a different setting for the 1st and 3rd Sundays each month. The informal service at 11 am on the 2nd Sunday and our successful Buggy Club will remain at the Vicarage.

To fulfil the desire of SPCC members to have a service in a "church" setting and to overcome the financial constraints of hiring St John's School Hall, James suggests a Family Service/Café church combining the best bits of both at St Britius Church at 11 am on 1st & 3rd Sundays. This would utilise St Brit's Sunday Club helpers and resources, the children's play area, baby changing and toilet facilities, refreshments all on site.

The new service would be used to encourage baptism families to attend on a regular basis and give a choice of times to attend church. (The 9.15 am communion service would remain each Sunday).

We would hope to use the Sunday Club band for music as well as CD's and hope both SPCC families and St Brit's families will come, giving Sunday Club a wider age range with the children also doing craft activities and helping with readings and prayers (as they do at Family Service now).



# **Observations and Conclusion**

Since the primary purpose of the book is to record the topics and themes employed through the life of the Necklace Project such that others might find the ideas and resources of use, the observations and conclusions chapter will be short.

We can count the Necklacfe Project as a success on several fronts. It brough together a team of lay people including those living on the Shilton Park Estate to collaborate and work on the project. So much depended on their efforts.

Although we kept no formal tally of attendance and numbers the various photos testify to the strength of support from families.

It should be noted that the Shilton Park estate was newly formed and grew through the length of the Necklace Project, eight years in all. So there were young families starting in their first homes. Over the years the youngsters grew up and people moved away from the estate to pastures new. The existance of St John's primary school on the estate with two very supportive heads in succession made a huge difference. The school was a well furnished and central meeting place. It was sad that we were forced to leave the school, first the buggy club and then SPCC. The decision to relocate with Light Zone taking place at St Britius church in the nearby village of Brize Norton clearly affected support.

We were lucky to have families willing to come. The Necklace Family hours were on a Sunday afternoon. It was noticable that the attendance changed with the nature of the Project as it became the Shilton Park Cafe church meeting in the mornings. A further change towards the end, and especially with the Light Zone was the further introduction of more formal worhip including communion.

People will see that there was a natural progression through the Necklace Project as the Christian message was promulgated. Many families stayed the course and it is remarkable how many are still in touch through social media including those who moved house and home away from Carterton and Brize Norton.

It is a mute point as to whether the Necklace Project could have gone on. Times were changing, children, and parents, had other interest on a Sunday. Eight years was a good period to sustain our efforts.

We very much hope that readers of this book will re-live their time with the Project, that's assuming they were with us at the time. For others this book may serve as a reservoir of ideas and themes, a ways to make church plants succeed elsewhere.

So we hurried out, the wife and I, anxious to help, not sure what we might find though fearing the worst. But what a surprise! There was no panic, no

sign of confusion. Quite the contrary they seemed so peaceful, so full of joy, utterly content.

And the way they looked at that child I mean, I've heard of worshipping your kids but this was something else they were over the moon, absolutely ecstatic!

Yet I can't help feeling I should have done more, that I let everyone down somehow — that it wasn't finally them I left out in the cold — it was me.

It had been hard enough to believe at the start, when the angel first broke the news to think that I, Mary, had been chosen above all others, singled out to bear in my womb the Messiah — but now, as I gazed down into the manger, and saw those little arms waving, that sweet innocent face wrinkled up in sleep, and those eyes so tightly shut, it seemed doubly impossible, out of the question, a foolish fancy of my fevered imagination. Be sensible, I told myself,

there's no way God could take such a gamble, no possibility, if the fate of the world truly hung in the balance, that he would stake it all on a helpless child, least of all one born where we found ourselves — a stable of all places!

And, as if to prove the point, that very moment ]esus awoke, tears filling his eyes, a scream of protest on his lips, and I realised he was hungry, well past his usual feed. It dawned on me then, the staggering implications — he needed me, this child, not just for food, or warmth, or protection, but for everything, his very future in my hands.

Would God allow that?

Could he ever need *us* as much as *we* need him? No, there had to be some mistake — it just couldn't be, could it? *Could it*?

I'm still not sure what happened — one moment night drawing in, and the next bright as day; one moment laughing and joking together, and the next rooted to the spot in amazement; one moment looking forward to getting home, and the next hurrying down to Bethlehem. There just aren't words to express what we felt,

but we knew we had to respond, had to go and see for ourselves. Not that we expected to find anything mind you, not if we were honest. Well, you don't, do you?

I mean, it's not every day the Messiah arrives, is it? And we'd always imagined when he finally did it would be in a blaze of glory, to a fanfare of trumpets, with the maximum of publicity. Yet do you know what?

When we got there it was to find everything just as we had been told, wonderfully special, yet surprisingly ordinary.

Not Jerusalem but Bethlehem, not a palace but a stable, not a prince enthroned in splendour but a baby lying in a manger.

We still find it hard to believe even now,

to think God chose to come through that tiny vulnerable child. But as the years have passed — and we've seen not just his birth but his life, and not just his life but his death, and not just his death but his empty tomb, his grave clothes, his joyful followers — we've slowly came to realise it really was true.

God had chosen to come to us, and more than that, to you to ordinary everyday people, in the most ordinary everyday of ways. How extraordinary!

Have you heard the news?

Do I believe it?

Well, I'm not sure. It's hard to credit, I admit, but this friend I spoke to seemed pretty certain. Heard it from a shepherd apparently, some chap who claimed to have seen the child for himself, and by all accounts he was delirious with excitement, absolutely full of it.

He may have been mistaken, of course, or simply spinning some old yarn — you never can be sure, can you?

And, believe me, I don't go round believing everything I hear.

But this friend of mine, the one who heard it from the shepherd, he was full of it too

You would have thought he'd been there,

in the stable,

beside the manger,

the way he spoke.

He was utterly convinced, there's no question about that, and as I listened to him chattering on, I felt the urge welling up inside me,

just as he had done, to tell someone else, to share the good news with those around me. If he was right then this wasn't something to keep to myself, not for the privileged few, but a message for everybody, one they all needed to hear. But before I say anything more, risk making a complete fool of myself, there's something I have to do — something my friend should have done and which the shepherds presumably did — and that is go and see for myself.

Call me a cynic if you like but I believe it's important — no, more than that, vital — for if you're going to accept something, let alone expect others to do the same, you have to be sure of your ground, as certain as you can be that it's not just all some grand delusion. So I'm going now,

off to find out the truth for myself, off to see this child, if he really exists, with my own eyes. And if I find everything just as I've been told,

the baby lying there in a manger, wrapped in strips of cloth, then I shall go and tell others what I have seen — for let's be honest, what else would there be to do? What else could anybody do in my place?

Do you know what we gave him — that little boy in Bethlehem? Go on, have a guess!

A rattle?

A toy?

A teddy bear?

No, nothing like that!

In fact, nothing you'd associate with a child at all, even if he was destined to be a king. Gold, that's what I brought!

And my companions?

Wait for it!

Frankincense and myrrh! Yes, I thought you'd be surprised, for, to tell the truth

we're pretty amazed ourselves looking back, unable to imagine what on earth possessed us to choose such exotic and unusual gifts. It wasn't so much that they were costly, though they were, of course — to a family like his they were riches beyond their dreams. But we could more than afford it — little more than small change to men of our means. No, it wasn't the price that troubled us afterwards, but the associations, the possible meaning his parents might have read into our presents when we'd gone. Not the gold, there was no problem there — a gift fit for a king and designed to say as much, of course.

But frankincense?

Well, the main use his people have for that, as we learned later, is to sweeten their sacrifices, to pour out on to their burnt offerings so that the fragrance might be pleasing to their God. Hardly the most appropriate gift for a baby.

But compared with myrrh!

Don't tell me you don't know? It was a drug used to soothe pain, either for that or as a spice for embalming — more fitting for a funeral than a birth, having more to do with suffering and death than celebration! So what were we thinking of?

What possible significance could gifts like those have for a little child? Frankly. I have no idea.

Yet at the time the choice seemed as obvious to us as following the star, as though each were all part of some greater purpose which would one day become clear to all.

Were we right?

Well, after all I've said, I rather hope not, for if this king was born to die, to be offered in sacrifice rather than enthroned in splendour, then his must be an unusual kingdom, very different from most we come across — in fact, you might almost say, not a kingdom of this world at all!

Loving God, you have given us and all the world Good News in Christ. Help us to hear that news afresh each day, recognising it is as good news for *us*.

Help us to receive it with both our minds and our hearts, always looking to understand more of what it continues to say.

And help us to share what Christ has done for us so that others in turn may celebrate what he has done for them.





## **Treasure Hunts**

Our most successful treasure hunt has been used many times including on occasion long after the Necklace Project itself. It was originally designed to be used outside where the treasure hunters had the space to run (or walk) to different locations around the field or recreation ground, but it has been used inside in a hall.

Essentially there were displays (A3 sized laminated) on boards located around the area. The participant was given a lettered sheet with a question which required them to go to a display board and then report back to the organiser who would give out the next clue. The hunt continued step by step until all the display boards had been visited and all the clues solved. Finally the winner (or winners) had to work out the anagram.




# **Shilton Park Street Hunt**


