


Dear Friend(s)

Highlights last year

Flower Festival at Gardens Open

Another very hot Sunday in June brought nearly two hundred visitors to the NGS Gardens Open in the village and to the Flower Festival in Church. Thanks are due to Dawn Humphris, Kath Bellenger, Jean Butcher, Karen Hawkins, Betty Holmes, Jacquie Griffin & Mary Holmes for the beautiful flower arrangements. The church received £134 as one of the nominated local organisations to benefit, for which we thank the Gardens Open Team.

Village Bash/School Fete

Thanks to Carolyn Peach once more for organising the teas at the Village Bash in July. Another sunny day brought many thirsty people into the hall for tea and cakes themed to



celebrate Women's Suffrage and the RAF Centenary and this made £221 for the church.

Bonfire Night

This year we sold 96 hot dogs, 33 cups of soup and lots of brownies to the villagers watching the fireworks and the village bonfire, and we made of profit of £119.

Remembrance Sunday

As part of the very successful celebrations of the 100th Anniversary of the ending of the first world war, the church hosted four silhouettes - "There but Not There" - from the Armed Forces Covenant Trust and these will remain in church permanently.

The church was full for the Remembrance Sunday Service with the collection of £256 for the Royal British Legion. In the afternoon we served teas to over a hundred people in the village hall making a profit of £270 for church funds. The church bells rang out at $7.05 \, \mathrm{pm}$ and $18 \, \mathrm{flickering}$ candles were placed on the war memorial as a fitting end to the celebration.
